

General Pest Technician



Our General Pest Technician course has been designed to deliver the required minimum competencies for trainee Pest Technicians to achieve their <u>General Pest Control license</u>.

This qualification is offered through an online blended delivery method (online theory and assessment), whilst under supervision of a qualified Pest Technician.

In this course students will build knowledge and skills to operate competently and safely to:

- Identify general pests' infestations (cause and severity)
- Develop and communicate management plans
- Select and maintain equipment and materials
- Complete applications using appropriate equipment

Units of Competency

- CPPUPM3005 Manage pests without applying pesticides
- CPPUPM3006 Manage pests by applying pesticides
- CPPUPM3018 Maintain equipment and pesticide storage area in pest management vehicles
